Conference Accolades: After gutsy high-flying performances, both Nik Stauskas and Derrick Walton Jr. picked up weekly Big Ten honors – Stauskas was named Big Ten Player of the Week (two straight) and the Oscar Robertson Player of the Week, while Walton was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week. Stauskas shot 57.7% from the field and sank 9-of-15 threes. On Wednesday, Nik tied a career-high with 26 points, while on Saturday he capped off a 19 point performance with a kiss to the Breslin faithful. En route to a career-high 19 points, Walton hit 8-straight free throws down the stretch to secure a Wolverines victory at the Breslin Center.

College basketball history: For the first time in school history, Michigan defeated three straight AP top-10 opponents this week: No. 3 Wisconsin, No. 10 Iowa, and No. 3 Michigan State. The last team to do that in the regular season was Iowa in 1986-87.
