The Wolverine hoopsters return to Crisler Arena this evening after defeating Michigan Tech 60-43 on Sunday afternoon. Courtney Sims and Daniel Horton each scored 13, and Lester Abram pitched in 12 for the winners. Tonight, we play Wayne State, a team that last came to Crisler for a 79-68 exhibition loss on November 1, 2002. The Warriors have yet to play an exhibition this season, but they come in as the pick to finish third in the GLIAC South after a year in which they reached the Division II Sweet Sixteen. The Rage's job tonight is to help our team to its second straight exhibition win, fine-tune our own repertoire for the regular season, and send WSU back down I-94 with a loss this evening. Let's fill up the bleachers and get Crisler Arena rocking for forty minutes!
