Welcome back to the Crisler Center! Our season begins with an exhibition game against our neighbors, the Concordia Cardinals. Be aware of a few new faces, as we have six additions to the roster. Let's keep the intensity we had in Atlanta in April and help our Wolverines get off to a great start this season.

We Meet Again: Today, the Cardinals made the 5.2 mile trek to Crisler for the first time in three years. Andrew Patrick (#14), Olsen, and Schaeffer, were the only current Cardinals present.
