Remember, it was just two years ago when Penn State made a visit to Crisler and recorded one of its three conference wins against the Wolverines, so there must be no holding back. For the students who are in attendance and the many non-students in the bleachers, we must stand and cheer for our team because the first Big Ten game is always important. 23	Tim Frazier	6'1" G	The junior leader from Houston, TX is "The fastest player ever I have ever coached" according to Pat Chambers.
11	Jermaine Marshall	6'4" G	Red-shirt sophomore missed the first game of the season due to a suspension for "violation of team rules".
5	Matt Glover	6'4" G	Matt played one year for Sheridan Community College in Wyoming where he was an honor roll student and recorded 11.8 points per game.
43	Ross Travis	6'6" F	Freshman from Chaska, MN attended the same high school (Chaska HS) as Michigan Women's BBall player Courtney Boylan.
44	Billy Oliver	6'8" F	Billy is an Academic All-Big Ten honoree, he was voted homecoming king, and supposedly is a pretty good piano player.
Coach	Patrick Chambers		First year coach from Pennsylvania left his head coaching job at Boston U after two years and an NCAA tourney birth.

Lone Wolf: While making a quick search up and down the Penn State roster, you'll have a difficult time finding many upper classman. In fact, you'll have a harder time finding a senior on the roster. The only senior on the Penn State basketball squad is Cammeron Woodyard (#24). He may have got been outplayed for the starting spot by sophomore Matt Glover, but that hasn't stopped him from making a name for himself. He has increased his minutes played throughout his four years and is now up to 25 minutes per game, averaging 8.1 ppg. If you're looking for something interesting about Cammeron, his father played basketball at Mount St. Mary's, who Penn State beat 72-43 earlier in December. Cammeron didn't start against The Mount, but recorded 14 points off of 20 minutes.

It turns out the Nittany Lions had to get another Trey, so they settled on now freshman **Trey Lewis** (#3) from just outside of Cleveland, OH. While Burke enjoys scoring and assists, Lewis enjoys playing the piano, rapping, and performing magic tricks.

Cammeron Woodyard suffered from blindness in 5th and 6th grade because he was shot in the eye with a BB gun.
