Free Throwin': Despite a rough shooting outing for the Maize and Blue at the Breslin Center, the Wolverines managed to go 17-19 from the line (led by Derrick Walton Jr.'s 14-15 mark), maintaining their 78.8% pace on the year, good for 4th in the country.
