Good-evening Maize Rage, and welcome back to Crisler Center for Michigan's final tune-up before traveling to Hawaii for the Maui Invitational next week. The Wolverines will be playing the Southern Mississippi Golden Eagles, who finished last season with an unspectacular 9-22 record, going 6-12 in Conference USA. Michigan has gotten off to slow starts in the first two games before ultimately pulling away at the end, and will be looking for a hot start tonight. Lets make sure to get loud from the opening tip and help the team get going early on.

Impact Transfer: Michigan fans have gotten to witness the early success of Kentucky transfer Charles Matthews, but Southern Miss also has a high-profile transfer from a power conference school. Point guard Tyree Griffin spent his first two years at Oklahoma State and is now eligible to play after sitting out last year as a transfer. In the first game of the season last Friday, Griffin scored 21 points, pulled down 13 rebounds, and dished out 5 assists in a 79-69 win over Southern New Orleans. It will be interesting to see how well he responds to the aggressive defense of Zavier Simpson.

Not To Be Overshadowed: The Golden Eagles' second-leading scorer from their season opener is also a Division I transfer. Dominic Magee is a transfer from Grand Canyon University who scored 15 points off the bench to go with 7 rebounds. He showed his aggression, getting to the free throw line 16 times in just 21 minutes of action, making 11 of his 16 attempts.

Working Out The Kinks: Michigan shot just over 29% from the three point line in their 72-65 win over Central Michigan. They rank 194th in the NCAA in three point percentage this year, shooting only 32% from behind the arc. Expect the Wolverine offense to shake off the early struggles, led by sharpshooter Duncan Robinson who is shooting 40% from deep in his first two games.

Things Are Looking Up: Jon Teske played 10 minutes against Central Michigan. He recorded 4 points, 2 blocks, 1 steal, and an assist. Look for him to continue to improve down in the paint, as he could be a big inside presence off the bench.

Efficiency: Zavier Simpson has gotten off to a hot start this year. So far, he's shooting 66% from the field and 60% from behind the arc. He is also averaging six assists per game and two steals in only 22 minutes of play.
