After a strong non-conference record, Minnesota has struggled early on in B1G play, sitting at 0-3. Senior Struggles: Andre Hollins (#1) excelled at Minnesota during his freshman and sophomore seasons under coach Tubby Smith. He was described as lacking the sufficient speed to play against B1G competition in Pitino's style of offense.

Dawkins sparked Michigan's comeback against Illinois and had 20 points total in the game with 6 three pointers. Dawkins also added 8 points against Penn State in 16 minutes of playing time including 2 assists and 2 rebounds.
