They Lost to Whom?: Like Michigan, Nebraska's team faced high expectations coming into this season, after making their first NCAA tournament appearance since 1998. Just like Michigan, those expectations were shattered after a stunning loss to an unknown team. For the Cornhuskers, the loss came on December 10th to the Incarnate Word Cardinals, a team that is ranked outside of the top 150.
