Michigan enters this season ranked no. 25 in the AP poll and fresh off an excellent exhibiton victory against Le Moyne. Northern Michigan, on the other hand, lost their last exhibition game in East Lansing, 94-53. Let's bring the energy tonight and start this season off by keeping it 100!

**Briefly:** The Wildcats have a 1-1 record in exhibition games thus far, falling to Little Brother but defeating Finlandia. Northern Michigan alumni includes the Angry Midget from East Lansing and former head football coach Lloyd Carr. In terms of notable alumni, they're also 1-1.
