Good afternoon Maize Rage and welcome back from winter break! Michigan will look to extend their 6-game winning streak against the Illinois Fighting Illini. The Illini have struggled to start this season under new head coach Brad Underwood, losing their first three Big Ten games in addition to notable losses against Wake Forest, UNLV, and New Mexico State. Michigan will play two ranked opponents next week in Purdue and Michigan State, which makes this game even more important to take care of at home.

Painful Memories: As the head coach at Oklahoma State, Brad Underwood faced Michigan in the first round of the NCAA Tournament last season, losing a 92-91 heartbreaker. Lucky for him, Derrick Walton won't be in a Michigan uniform this time around, as he scored 26 points and dished out 11 assists in that game.

Braggin' Rights: Every December since 1980, Illinois and Missouri have played a neutral site game in St. Louis, which is about a two hour drive from both campuses. For the 5th consecutive year, the Illini beat Missouri by a score of 70-64, behind 22 points from Trent Frazier and 20 points from Leron Black.

Absolutely on Fire: Junior guard Aaron Jordan has had a breakout season shooting the ball for Illinois, making 32 of his 58 three point attempts, good for 55.2%. That puts him 12th in the nation in 3-point shooting percentage and 2nd in the Big Ten (through Wednesday's games), behind only Michigan State's Cassius Winston.
