Good Evening Ragers and Happy Martin Luther King Jr. Day! After a double-digit win in East Lansing over Michigan State, we are back in action against the Maryland Terrapins. The Terps are coming off a 21 point loss on the road against Ohio State and have struggled recently. Tonight is a big opportunity for the Wolverines to add another conference win to the resume.

Fear the Turtle?: Testudo the Turtle is the mascot of the University of Maryland. A mascot tends to represent a school's sports teams. For example, wolverines have a reputation for ferocity and strength out of proportion to their size, which is reflective of the Michigan basketball team. However, Testudo is a terrapin, which prey on shrimp and other small sea creatures. This is similar to Maryland's basketball team in that they had one of the weakest non-conference schedules in the country, ranking 300th out of 351 teams, including a matchup with D-III program, Catholic University. Maryland hasn't seemed prepared for better competition, as the Terrapins have lost by a combined 59 points against Ohio State and Michigan State.

Injury Issues: The Terrapins had a rough week earlier this season, losing both sophomore forward Justin Jackson to a torn labrum and junior forward Ivan Bender to a torn meniscus. Jackson was a preseason All-Big Ten selection and was seen as a potential first-round pick in the upcoming NBA Draft. Bender was seen as the top candidate to replace Jackson's productivity, but got hurt just four days after Jackson's injury was announced.
