Good evening Wolverines and welcome to Crisler! The team has been on quite the hot streak for the past month, and they're certainly going to need it to continue this week. Tonight it'll be the fifth ranked Purdue Boilermakers and this weekend Michigan will make the trip to East Lansing to face fourth ranked Michigan State. Tonight, make sure to get loud and help the team take down the highly questionably named Boilermakers!

Big Men, Big Trouble: Big men have been a staple for Matt Painter the last couple of years, and this year is no different. B1G Player of the Year Caleb Swanigan is gone, but 7-footer Isaac Haas has returned, and Purdue has added another in 7'3" Matt Haarms. This could be an issue for Purdue, however, as the 7 footers will have to defend the perimeter in order to win tonight.

Trouble in Paradise: Purdue has had a strong season, but they had one notable hiccup early on. Traveling to the Bahamas for their early-season tournament, Purdue dropped their first two games against Tennessee and Western Kentucky before defeating Arizona in the consolation game. Arizona, who entered that tournament #2 in the nation, also struggled in the Bahamas, but hadn't lost since, until this weekend. A bad omen for Purdue perhaps?

Heating Back Up: Junior Moe Wagner had been struggling since his return from injury against Jacksonville on December 30th, but got back on track Saturday against Illinois. Wagner scored 14 points on 6/7 from the field and pulled down 7 rebounds as well. Wagner will be key this week as Michigan plays two top-5 opponents.

Staying Hot: Freshman Isaiah Livers kept his hot streak going, scoring 12 points against Illinois, including a pair of dunks and an alley-oop, to spark Michigan to a 79-69 win. Livers has helped provide the Wolverines with valuable depth as Big Ten play has restarted.

Fair or Foul?: Redshirt sophomore Charles Matthews only played 16 minutes against Illinois due to foul trouble, but was still able to make an impact. Despite not being on the floor for most of the game, Matthews scored 10 points on a perfect 4/4 from the field. Michigan will need Matthews on the floor as conference play continues.
