

Good evening Wolverines and welcome back to Crisler! Our season is underway and off to a great start as we go into the game tonight against the Holy Cross Crusaders. Hailing from Worcester, Massachusetts, the Crusaders are coming in hot after a 93-81 win against the Sacred Heart Pioneers on Tuesday. Let's show them what we're made of in Crisler Center tonight!

Claim to Fame: The 2015-16 season was the making of a Cinderella story for the Crusaders. They went 5-13 in conference play during the regular season, and won the Patriot League Tournament as a #9 seed. That got them a spot in the NCAA Tournament as a #16 seed, but they lost to Oregon in the first round. The Crusaders have made the NCAA tournament a total of 13 times since the program started in 1900, winning it all in 1947 in fact, but haven't been able to win a tournament game since 1953.

Underclassman Threat: Sophomore guard Austin Butler had a breakout performance in the season opener with 26 points. Senior Pat Benzan followed with a solid 19 points with the help of 11 assists from fellow senior Jehyve Floyd. The Crusaders were on a hot streak, shooting 56% from the field and finally breaking 90 points—something they haven't done since 2015. Though their shots were falling, they allowed the Pioneers to shoot 67% from the field, leaving us to wonder how their defense will hold up against our top shooters such as Livers and Matthews.

Strong Play Off the Bench: Sophomores Isaiah Livers and Eli Brooks had strong performances off the bench against the Spartans. Each played over 20 minutes, shot 60% or better from the field, and each tied for fourth in scoring on the team with 8 points.

Big Man Energy: Junior big man Jon Teske was a force down near the basket on both ends of the court. Not only did he lead the team in scoring with 13 points, but he also had 8 boards, 4 blocks, and even a steal. The 7'1 Monster of Medina looks to continue his strong performance against Holy Cross.
