Today we celebrate the second-ever Poole Party, as your Michigan Wolverines face off against the Gamecocks from the University of South Carolina. This is our last official non-break game for the next month, so make sure to get as rowdy as you can and show our friends from the SEC what Big Ten basketball is all about!

Not So SCARy This Time Around: The Gamecocks limp into Crisler Center sporting a putrid record of 4-4. Maybe they've had to navigate a difficult non-conference schedule? Nope. Their four losses come from the likes of Stony Brook, Providence, Wofford, and Wyoming, and they have yet to notch a single win against a team from a major basketball conference. The last time Michigan matched up with South Carolina came on November 23rd, 2016, with the Gamecocks coming away victorious 61-46 on their home floor, and with that SCAR squad making it all the way to the Final Four that year. This year's contest looks to feature vastly different Michigan and South Carolina teams and some retribution appears to be in store: do vou really think Coach Beilein ever forgets a bad loss?
