Welcome back, Ragers! It's been a long two weeks since our last home game. During our Thanksgiving break, the Wolverines were crowned champions in the Bahamas for the annual "Battle 4 Atlantis", winning games against perennial powers and top ten teams, North Carolina and Gonzaga. Although dropping the first game of the Howard era Tuesday night in Louisville, the Wolverines are still in the top 5 and look to start the conference season on the right foot.

The Lamest of the Avengers: The Hawkeyes travel into Crisler Center with a 6-2 record and a win for the Big Ten in the B1G/ACC Challenge over Syracuse. Although dropping two games to unranked opponents in this early season, lowa also owns an impressive win over 12th ranked Texas Tech on Thanksgiving in the Las Vegas Invitational. The strongest facet of their victory was shooting 40.1% from the three point line.

Looking for Revenge: These two only met one time before the postseason last year and that was in Carver Arena in Iowa City. That game resulted in U of M's second loss of the season with a handily 74-59 win and a storming of the court. When it counted, Michigan spoiled Iowa's B1G Tournament Championship hopes in Chicago mid-March with a 74-53 victory, moving UM to the semifinal round the next day.

Respecting Our Elders: Two players for the Hawkeyes seem to have been around since the ice age; Luka Garza and Jordan Bohannon. Points and rebounds leader, Luka Garza, 6'11, 260 pound Center, returns for yet another matchup against Jon Teske. He averages a double-double per game. On the other end, Bohannon adores the three point shot, leading the team in attempts and has a 34.8% spot in the column.

Balled in the Bahamas: The Wolverines had an incredible run during Feast Week, toppling lowa State, North Carolina, and Gonzaga and adding another trophy to the collection. In the three games the Wolverines played, UM made 33 of its 70 three-point attempts; their opponents made just 32 of their 69 dunk and layup attempts.

Meteoric Rise: After dominating two top-10 opponents in UNC and the Zags, the Wolverines made the largest jump in the history of the basketball AP Poll. From receiving a paltry 12 votes a week ago, Michigan surged to #4 in the nation and received 9 first-place votes.

Dealt a Bad Hand: The Cards of Louisville absolutely stymied the Michigan offense Tuesday, limiting the Wolverines to a 25.9% FG clip and only 3 threes. Teske led the way with 18 points and 10 rebounds, while Zavier was held to a season-low 3 assists and Isaiah shot 1-9 from the floor. The Cards' packline defense and hedging hard on ball screens proved to be an effective antidote to a potent Michigan offense.

DJ Wilson: Lanky Smoove had a breakout performance on Saturday night after not logging much playing time this season leading up. Wilson played 23 minutes in a 137-96 win for his Bucks over the Hornets. He scored 11 points, grabbed three rebounds and recorded three assists.

Glenn Robinson III: Averages 11.5 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game. Had a career-high 25 points and recorded 2 assists and 5 rebounds in a loss to the Thunder on Nov. 25

Tim Hardaway Jr.: Averaging 12.9 points, 2.1 rebounds and 1.9 assists on the season. Scored 31 points on 10-for-18 shooting and 5-for-11 from three in a win over the Rockets on Nov. 24. Had 26 points and 3 rebounds in a win over the Suns on Nov. 29
