Good evening, Ragers! Coming off a shaky OT win against Oakland on Sunday, Michigan basketball looks to reach 3-0 tonight in Ann Arbor. While other BIG 10 teams like MSU and Iowa have been steamrolling difficult opponents, the Wolverines will need to consolidate their talent to hang on in the conference projections.

#### Not that You Want to Relive Sunday...

What even is 2020? An Oakland team that trailed Xavier by 41 at halftime took the 25th ranked Wolverines to overtime on Sunday. If not for budding star Freshman Hunter Dickinson, Michigan may have dented their resume for the rest of their season with a loss, as Dickinson scored 19 points in only 25 minutes of action, while playing all five minutes of overtime. It started with the 20 turnovers. Oakland didn't do a great job either, turning the ball over 16 times. Under Coach John Beilein, turnovers were something that Michigan prided itself on. Secondly, poor 3-point shooting plagued the Maize and Blue. After shooting 5-7 from range against BGSU, Chaundee Brown shot 1-10 from deep, Altogether as a team, Michigan shot 8-27, and thankfully Oakland was worse with an 8-34 mark.

The eyebrow raiser was the tension seen between Head Coach Juwan Howard and Senior Captain Isaiah Livers. During a cold streak in the 1st half, there was a verbal altercation between the two as Coach Howard was holding the captain accountable for his team's lack of effort in the half. After the game Isaiah spoke with reporters and said, "Weirdly enough, that's how we communicate. We argue in practice, go at it during games, go at it during scrimmages. It doesn't matter because he just wants me to be a great player, and I respect him for that". Later in the game, Livers netted a clutch 3 and was seen emphatically chest bumping his coach after. He finished with a game high 22 points in the 81-71 bone jittering victory. The next day, the Wolverines were removed from the top 25.

#### About the Cardinals:

This will only be Ball State's second game of the season. They are coming off a one-point loss last Wednesday to Northern Kentucky, one of the Horizon league's best teams in the past couple years. The Cardinals' sixth-year player K.J. Walton had a monster game, tallying 28 points and 11 rebounds in only 27 minutes of action. However, the team as a whole struggled from the free throw line (52.4%) and beyond the arc (26.1%).

Tonight's matchup will be just the fifth game ever played between Michigan and Ball State, and the first of the series played in this century. The last meeting between the two took place on November 16, 1998, when Ball State beat Michigan for the first and only time in their history, 75-64. In the games prior, however, Michigan's wins were more than decisive; the Wolverines won by an average of 28 points in the teams' first three matchups. Michigan will look to extend their series lead to 4-1 with a win tonight.
