The Wolverines are coming off a an annhiliation of Wisoconsin at home and their first loss of the season to Minnesota on Saturday. They find themselves still ranked 7th in the AP Poll and look to regain some confidence tonight against an earlier-recognized Maryland.

Wowing Wisco:

Michigan's biggest anticipated matchup of the season was played last Tuesday against 9th-ranked Wisconsin at the Crisler Center. The game was tight with 6:21 remaining in the 1st half with a 3 point spread between the two. After that, Michigan blew Bucky open. Michigan blitzed the Badgers and led by 17 at the break. The Wolverines let the whole country know that they were tired of being underrated by all media and analysts because of their "weak schedule". At one point, Michigan led 69-29 against an AP Top 10 team. Talk about a statement. Michigan inserted the bench mob at the 4-minute timeout and turned on cruise control to a 77-54 victory.

Gophers being Golden:

After rewiring Minnesota on the 6th, the Gophers gave Michigan the business Saturday afternoon. Although no fans are being allowed in B1G arenas this season, Minnesota certainly treats The Barn as if there were 14,500 fans in animal costumes. Coming in the Gophers were 10-0 at home with wins against lowa, Michigan State and Ohio State. They added an Eli Brooks-less Michigan to that list by trouncing the Wolverines in the 2nd half. This game was really the first time that Hunter Dickinson seemed like a freshman. Drake transfer Liam Robbins scored 22 points and snatched 8 boards in a dominant performance. Chaundee Brown Jr. played a good role for Michigan leading the scoring with 14 points although tasked with trying to lock down one of the best players in the conference in Marcus Carr (17 points on 6-18 shooting). The 75-57 loss was the first on the season for Michigan.

Terp Trials:

This matchup between the Wolverines and the Terrapins will be the second this season and the 14th all time. Michigan's 84-73 victory on New Year's Eve put them ahead 7-6 in the all time series. That win in College Park was led by a dominant homecoming performance from Hunter Dickinson (26pts, 11 rebs). Maryland kept the last matchup close in the first half due to some hot shooting behind the arc, ending at 59% from 3 as a team. The Wolverines will look to contain that 3 point shooting and bounce back from their loss to Minnesota.

Maryland is currently 8-6, but only 2-5 in B10 play, with one of the losses coming to Michigan already. However, their two B10 wins were on the road against Wisconsin and Illinois, so they are capable of competing with anyone. They are not a very deep team with only 7 players averaging more than 15 minutes a game. Maryland scores 73.7 PPG on 47.5% shooting from the field and 37.3% from deep, and they take care of the ball with only 11.1 turnovers per game. Maryland is going to be looking for revenge from NYE.
