Good evening, Ragers! After dominating Northwestern Sunday night to stay undefeated, the Wolverines now appear with their first Top 10 ranking in the AP Poll. Seven Big 10 teams remain ranked as well, as Michigan looks to take down the 16th-ranked Golden Gophers tonight.

Cats = Crushed:

In the first game back to the Crisler Center after the holidays, the Wolverines performed to the highest of standards in front of their parents on Sunday night. After allowing a swift eight points from Larry Nance's son, Pete, and giving three late Christmas presents in the forms of turnovers, Michigan settled in and didn't look back against 19th ranked Northwestern. In what was called the first "true test" of the season against a Wildcat team who has beaten 4th-ranked Michigan State and 23rd-ranked Ohio State, Michigan dominated the final 36 minutes of the game. In the spotlight was Hunter Dickinson scoring 19 and Chaundee Brown, Franz Wagner, Eli Brooks netting 14 apiece. Franz Wagner also added a dominant five blocks in what was his most complete game of the season. Superb three point shooting was a great addition to the statline for Michigan going 12-27 from behind the arc.

Bench Mob:

Although the final four minutes won't look dominant, Michigan worked with a rotation of bench mob members; Zeb Jackson, C.J. Baird, Adrien Nuñez, Terrance Williams, Jaron Faulds, and Jace Howard. Although it looks like T-Will may be the official 7th player in the rotation, he provided quality minutes especially on the defensive end. Perhaps the coolest part of the night was Jace's first points as a Wolverine coming as an and-1 layup assisted by the birthday boy, C.J. Baird which was followed by emotional fist pumps from dad on the sideline. Michigan was vaulted to #10 in the AP poll a day after the dominant 85-66 win and will face another formidable opponent in Minnesota on Wednesday.

Gopher Grudges:

Tonight's game will be the 127th meeting between Michigan and Minnesota, and the fifth in the last two years. Michigan will enter with a 20-game lead in the series overall, having won 73 games to Minnesota's 53. While the Wolverines are playing a formidable Minnesota squad who are ranked for the first time since 2013, they have lost only three of their almost 20 matchups against the Golden Gophers over the last decade.

Minnesota has been another surprise team in a loaded B10 conference this year. They are currently ranked 16th with a record of 10-2 (3-2 in B10 play) with marquee wins over lowa, MSU, OSU, and SLU. They are led by Marcus Carr, the third leading scorer and leader in assists in Big Ten, and Liam Robbins, the Big Ten blocks leader, who is also coming off a massive 27pt, 14reb, 5blk game against OSU. As a team, Minnesota shoots 42.3% from the field but only 30.9% from three. They take pretty good care of the ball, averaging 11.3 turnovers with an assist to turnover ratio of 1.45. This will be Michigan's toughest test yet.

Pro Blue Update

Duncan Robinson:

Off to a hot start this season with the Miami Heat, Robinson is shooting 48% from three. He also had a standout Christmas Day game in which he scored 23 points--including an eye-catching seven triples.

Caris LeVert:

Starting the season with the Nets, LeVert is already pumping out an impressive 15 ppg.

Tim Hardaway Jr.:

After signing recently with the Dallas Mavericks, Hardaway Jr. is also averaging around 15 points per game so far to kick of his 2020-2021 campaign.
