To comply with the Big Ten sportsmanship code, the "Burn of the Game" has been replaced by the "Player to Watch": D'Mitrik Trice Good evening, Ragers! After a commanding win over Minnesota on Wednesday night to stay undefeated, the 7th ranked Wolverines look to take on 9th-ranked Wisconsin in a Top 10 matchup. As the highest-ranked team Michigan has met so far, the Badgers will prove to be a telling challenge.

Golden Ticket:

Michigan's game against 16th-ranked Minnesota on Jan. 6th was supposed to be the toughest test for the Wolverines so far this season. After 7:22 remaining in the first half, the game never got closer than a 6 point margin. Although Michigan led by 12 soon after that mark, Minnesota's Marcus Carr blitzed the Wolverines with two straight threes and a pair of free throws to bring the halftime edge to 6 points. Michigan didn't look back in the 2nd half. After the 8-0 Minnesota run, Michigan went on a 39-8 marathon. Michigan was able to again play the bench mob for a good amount of time around the four minute timeout. Perhaps the most important part of that time was Zeb Jackson getting important minutes. In the scenario where Eli Brooks misses extended time or Mike Smith and Chaundee Brown go down with injuries, the Freshman from Toledo will have to step in and provide quality minutes. He went 1-3 and scored 2 points in 8 minutes while also sinking an impressive jumper, which was negated by a travel.

Michigan's Marathon:

As mentioned above, Michigan had a very impressive run of 39-8 after Minnesota went on an 8-2 run. A noteworthy post on twitter from @BGWolverines reminded us that the run against the Gophers wasn't the first time. After Northwestern and Maryland's 5-0 runs, Michigan went on a 39-14 and 19-2 sprint. Another noticeable run for Michigan was after UCF went on a 11-0 run in the 1st half. The Wolverines countered with a 51-13 run against the Knights. In almost every game this season, Michigan has responded with multiple runs of their own to propel themselves into a position to win.

Beating the Badgers:

This will be the 126th all time matchup between the Badgers and the Wolverines. Michigan leading 70-55. The most recent result was a loss to Wisconsin last February, 81-74, despite Zavier Simpson's 32 points. D'Mitrik Trice (28 pts) was the man to stop in that game, as he may also be this year. Additionally, Greg Gard and his Badgers will look to spoil Michigan's undefeated start to the season, as they did to Beilein's 2018-19 team with a 64-54 defensive led performance...

Wisconsin has been one of the best teams in the Big Ten so far, currently ranked 9th with a record of 10-2 (4-1 B10 play). Their two losses have come to Maryland and Marguette but both were competitive games. Wisconsin has experience and leadership with all 5 starters being seniors and depth with 8 players averaging 15+ minutes per game. As a team, they shoot 46.3% from the field and a scorching 41.4% from three. They also take great care of the ball with only 8.2 turnovers per game (2nd in nation), and play good defense, only giving up 61.5 ppg. This should be a physical, low-scoring defensive battle.

Duncan Robinson:

Zavier Simpson:

The 6'0" guard is a first round pick in the 2021 G League draft. He goes as the seventh overall pick to the OKC Blue.
